[1 Step one

{nload Your Gun} No ammo should be present while cleaning is performed. } Disassemble shotgun

b}Apply bore cleaner of choice . [Use if desired , many kit owners use the kit on dry barrels very effectively.]

[2 Step two

Open kit box

lidentify chamber brush by color.Red is for choke or muzzle end only [this is to avoid using the wrong brush in the future] Brass color is the chamber end only} Assemble cleaning rod and attach chamber brush

[3 Step three

A}Insert chamber brush into breech end of barrel, or the end you put the ammo in, using a clockwise rotation. [this is important because a counter clockwise rotation either on insertion or extraction may result the unscrewing of the brush from the rod and cause some frustration in attempting to remove or reattach while stuck in the barrel.]

b) be careful to only insert the brush up to the joint in the cleaning rod where it screws together. This will be about 15 inches in length and will protect the brush and lengthen it's useful life.

C}repeat as many times as desired depending on the initial condition of the chamber re dirty vs clean.

4 Step four

Remove chamber brush return it to kit, and attach choke brush.

B} Leaving the choke in the barrel, insert choke brush from muzzle end of barrel using the same clockwise rotation as used with the chamber brush. insert to the complete length of the rod. Withdraw the brush with that same twisting motion .

C{repeat step as many times as desired depending on the initial degree of cleanliness of the barrel..

[5 Step five

Return choke brush to kit and attach mop attachment to cleaning rod.b} repeat step 3 and step four using mop attachment

6] Step six

To clean brushes, a gun scrubber productwill work fine as will . The mop attachment may be cleaned satisfactorily we recomend Dawn dish soap and water.
